- Erasmus students are <u>not</u> obliged to fully complete a module. It is allowed to choose only one element within a specific module.
- As almost all classes are taught in German language, Erasmus students are obliged to obtain a German level of B1 prior to their semester in Dortmund. Module 11 (newsroom training) requires a German level of B2.
